## Scope of Requirements

Lot 1 Residential Textiles and Student and Conferencing Packs  
Lot 2 Window Coverings (National)  
Lot 3 Linen and Laundry Services

The Residential Textiles and Linen Services Framework has been established for the provision of the following goods:

Lot 1 covers the supply of residential textiles and kitchen starter packs. The framework agreement is designed for the bulk supply of in scope products to member institution sites for use predominantly in student residential accommodation & conferencing settings. This lot covers the supply of the following goods: Bedding Textiles, in a variety of fabrics and sizes, not limited to bedlinen & bedding packs; duvets, pillows, mattress and bedding protectors, blankets. Bathroom Textiles including towels, face cloths, bathmats, and shower curtains; along with other associated accommodation products. Kitchen starter packs and associated kitchenware and accommodation products, both in packs & individually to include but not be limited to: Cooking aids including but not limited to pans, boards, sheets, glassware, stoneware, ceramicware, knives, utensils, and storage. Dinnerware including but not limited to cutlery, crockery, glass and plastic tableware. Kitchen linens. This lot also covers the supply of the above in-scope goods, across the United Kingdom, directly to the student.

Lot 2 covers supply only and supply & installation of a range of curtains, blinds and other window coverings including but not limited to manual and electric roller, venetian, & vertical blinds in a range of fabrics and materials; black out, dim out, lined & non-lined curtains in a range of fabrics; and window films. Products will be provided in both occupied and unoccupied areas of a member institution's estate including but not limited to student, residential and commercial accommodation, teaching areas including lecture theatres, bathrooms, offices, storerooms, reception areas, corridors, and stairways. Installations may be required in buildings of historical interest or listings.

Lot 3 covers the provision of fully managed linen and laundry services which will include but is not limited to: linen hire and laundering services entailing article provision, article collection & return, washing and finishing, ironing, dry cleaning, stain removal, alternations and tumble drying. The services will be required across a range of articles including but not limited to accommodation linen (including but not limited to duvet covers, pillowcases, sheets), event linen (including but not limited to tablecloths) and bathroom textiles. Articles will be predominantly for conferencing use.

### Responsible Procurement

When the Supplier has been engaged for installation, the Supplier will remove and dispose of any related waste packaging as required by the Member Institution free of charge. The packaging will be recycled where possible.

Suppliers must endeavour where possible not to utilise any filler that is made from non-recyclable materials, particularly plastics or polystyrene in the delivery of goods purchased through this Framework. Where suppliers are distributing boxed end products from a third party they are required to work with their supply chain to remove the use of these materials from their fulfilment process. Progress against these aims will form part of the discussion at contract management meetings.

Member Institutions reserve the right to require all supplier personnel, including but not limited to delivery staff, who access Member Institutions' premises to have a valid Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) certification where deemed necessary.

As discussed above, the agreement includes repair and maintenance services within scope; along with recycling and disposal services which rewarded schemes which optimise this higher levels of the waste hierarchy.
